Community Need:

- Barrie Food Bank has seen over 900 new users over the past year¹
- At the David Busby Street Centre there's been a 25 per cent increase in the number of people using their services²
- The Salvation Army, the facilities are always full³
- One in five Canadian children are at risk of going to school on an empty stomach⁴
- The price of food in Ontario has increased at a rate of 3.1% per year while social assistance and employment rates have failed to keep pace. 5
- All existing community gardens in Barrie are at capacity

Community Benefits:

- Helps to achieve the goals of the Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit's report on preventing chronic disease and promoting healthy weights in children and youth, including:
 - o increase physical activity/decrease sedentary behaviour,
 - o increase healthy eating,
 - o promote healthy weights,
 - o improve sleep
- Increased economic activity & jobs
 - o In 2014, the province of Ontario imported more than \$23.4 billion in food and exported just under \$12.5 billion. More than 50% of the \$20 billion in imported food products can be produced in Ontario. If Ontario produced 10% of the top fruit and vegetable imports, the Ontario economy could benefit by nearly an additional quarter of a billion dollars in GDP and 3,400 more full-time jobs⁶
- Gives opportunities for skill-building & increased community diversity
