RE: ONTARIO GO OPEN DATA CONFERENCE

DATE: APRIL 23, 2018

The purpose of this Memorandum is to provide Members of Council with an overview of the upcoming conference GO Open Data (GOOD) 2018, which will be hosted by City of Barrie in partnership with Georgian College and Open Knowledge Canada on May 11-12, 2018. This event is being collaboratively organized by staff in Innovate Barrie and the Creative Economy Department of Invest Barrie. The event is aligned with both Invest Barrie's objective to support economic resiliency through the promotion of innovation tools, techniques, learning opportunities and best practices, as well as Innovate Barrie's goals of becoming a leader in innovation, aligning people, processes and technology. The event will furthermore position the City of Barrie as a possible test bed for data driven smart city initiatives.

The GO Open Data conference has been hosted by municipalities across Ontario for six consecutive years. Since its inception in 2013 with City of Waterloo and the University of Waterloo, the event has been held in Toronto, Niagara, Markham, and London. The inter-disciplinary nature of open data leads to a broad range of participants from across Ontario representing the public, private, academic, and non-profit sectors, as well as independent enthusiasts. Hosting the event has typically been a catalyst to mobilizing local open data champions in the host community, in addition to providing a platform to launch municipal programs related to open data.

The 2018 GOOD conference will be held on Friday May  $11^{th}$ , 2018 from 8:00 am - 4:00 pm at Georgian College, and a "Hackathon" format workshop on Saturday May  $12^{th}$ , 2018 from 9:00 am - 3:00 pm at the City Hall Rotunda. The conference theme will be 'Open Data and Smart Communities' and will launch with a morning keynote.

#### Featured keynote panelists are:

- Dr. Pamela Robinson, Ryerson University Associate Dean of Graduate Studies and Strategic Initiatives
  for the Faculty of Community Services, and Associate Professor in the School of Urban and Regional
  Planning. Her focus is on urban sustainability and the role of open data and civic technology in open
  government transformations.
- Bonnie Healy, Chair of Board of Directors, Alberta First Nations Information Governance Centre, acts
  as a liaison between First Nations communities and Western data systems. She has worked in
  healthcare at local, national, and international levels and will discuss her mission to improve health
  outcomes for First Nations people through facilitated partnerships for data collection and research.
- Jean Noé-Landry, social entrepreneur and Executive Director of OpenNorth, Canada's leading not-forprofit specializing in open data and civic technology. He has supported political institutions and civic movements in over 12 countries and brought the open government tool "CitizenBudget" to more than 90 cities in North America.

A lunch and networking session will be held from 12:30 pm – 1:30 pm. The afternoon will feature a discussion on the Healthy Barrie initiative by the Barrie Family Health Team. Additional sessions will include Open Health and Safety, Business and Smart Communities, Open Government, and Digital Justice, presented by industry leaders and practitioners from organizations such as the Centre for International Governance Innovation, City of Toronto, University of Guelph, and Kingston-Frontenac Public Health.
