Snowbirds to fly into Barrie this summer

(Barrie, ON) The Canadian Forces Snowbirds will be in Barrie to kick-off Canada Day weekend celebrations with two shows on June 28 and 29. Snowbird pilots Capt. Robbie Hindle and Capt. Arpit Mahajan flew into Lake Simcoe Regional Airport this morning to make the announcement.

The event will be put on in partnership with CFB Borden and the Downtown Barrie Business Association and will take place over Kempenfelt Bay leading into Downtown Barrie's Promenade Days (June 29 to July 1) and the City's annual Canada Day festivities and fireworks (July 1).

"We're extremely thankful to our partners for once again making this event possible," said Mayor Jeff Lehman. "We look forward to welcoming the snowbirds back to Barrie for another exciting show to kick-off an incredible weekend of celebrating our great country."

The thrilling display of 9-jet precision flying is made possible thanks to a highly skilled team of pilots, technicians, and support personnel from all over our country.
