Safe Injection Site "Safe Consumption Site"?

90 Mulcaster Street Barrie ON. Wednesday May 29 2019

Honorable Mayor Lehman and council members that voted yes to the safe injection site to be located at 90 Mulcaster Street in downtown Barrie.

I was at the meeting May 27th Council Chambers. What I saw was a lot of deception. I was told by Councillor Keenan that all residents directly impacted would receive a notice in the mail about the meeting at Collier Street Church on May 15th. I [REDACTED] from the proposed site NO! DID NOT GET ANY NOTIFICATION. No one I know in the surrounding area received notifications. WHY NOT?

Clearly not enough research has been done about putting this type of establishment in a residential area. Next to a dysfunctional OUT OF CONTROL street center "Busby Center". I did not hear that anyone went to see the London site where there is a SIS in an apartment building that houses a street center on location. From what I heard it is a complete disaster!

The estimated number of persons using the Barrie site is 35 to 40 persons daily. That is approximately 1100 drug crazed intravenous drug users flooding into our neighbourhood. A Petri dish consisting of heroine, crystal meth, fentanyl, crack, cocaine and whatever else they can shoot up! These people are using hard dangerous drugs in a dangerous manner, making them also dangerous. Have you ever see a person shoot up some meth or crack?? It is scary they become unstable, unhinged then you want to turn them loose in a residential neighbourhood. There are children, families, seniors all being put in harm's way.

Are you considering that these people's taxpaying citizens of Barrie are nothing more to you that collateral damage!!

There was no talk of increased police presence in the area. It was also stated by one council member that he was in favor if it did not cost Barrie any money. Well it will cost Barrie money! Tax dollars! When our land values drop unable to find tenants to rent because of your decisions there are laws to protect us give us some shelter. There will be an expense to the city to do this right. More drug addicts you invite into an area more police presence to patrol the area is absolutely necessary on foot as well. Police "WALKING THE BEAT" to help protect us and our homes from what is inevitable "MORE CRIME AND VIOLENCE IS COMING"

Please take more time, do more research on the results of what this type of establishment has when located in a residential area, next to an OUT OF CONTROL street center!! Thank you Neil Little
