Three prospective houses apparently are:

- Large property (brick house) north west corner of Tollendale and Royal Oak.
- Large property (blue house) a bit further down south side of Tollendale beside the forest.
- Smaller brick building with more recent addition across from the park, second from the corner of Tollendale and Coxmill.

None of these houses are in their original condition, and current owners of historic properties are often concerned about encountering restrictions. However, it adds to the character of the community if there is some sort of recognition.

We are most familiar with this type of project from the plaques displayed in front of historic properties in the Pointe-Claire/Beaconsfield suburbs of Montreal, where we lived for many years.
