SPECIAL EVENT PERMIT PROCESS

- The City's Special Events Office (SEO) has opened the 2018 application process for returning events and applications are due December 15, 2017; new event applications will be considered in January 2018.
- Permits by the numbers:
 - \circ 121 events were processed in 2016; 103 processed so far in 2017
 - 12 film permit requests were processed in 2016; 8 film permits processed so far in 2017 and 10 location inquiries received
- With Meridian Place coming online in 2018, an increase in permit applications is anticipated an operation and programming model is being developed in conjunction with the BIA and the SEO is working to streamline the Special Event Permit process.
- SEO staff continue to meet regularly with internal stakeholders to review construction projects at Centennial Park and Memorial Square/Meridian Place to ensure that we are up-to-date on the construction schedule and any potential impact to events. The SEO is working with all events impacted by construction to find alternative locations and/or dates.
- Barrie's Event Action Team (BEAT) continues to meet monthly and engage stakeholders directly involved in facilitating events and issuing permits and approvals.

Upcoming Events:

- Santa Claus Parade & Noella Kick-off (Tree Lighting) November 18
 - Noella Kick-off (Tree Lighting) is organized by the Downtown Barrie BIA due to construction in Memorial Square/Meridian Place, will set-up along Dunlop Street and at the foot of Owen Street.
 - Santa Claus Parade is organized by the Barrie Chamber of Commerce marshals on Lakeshore Drive, departs at 5:00pm from Bradford Street at Tiffin Street and travels north on Bradford Street, east on Dunlop Street, finishing at Mulcaster Street.
 - Road closures will include:
 - Lakeshore Drive from Southshore to Tiffin noon to 6:30pm parade marshaling area
 - Dunlop Street East from Bayfield to Mulcaster noon to midnight safety of spectators, reduction in parking enforcement, and post-parade clean-up
 - Remainder of the route will be a rolling closure facilitated by Barrie Police
 - Pre-warning signage will be erected on Dunlop Street 2 weeks in advance of the event, notifications will be distributed by BIA and Chamber, and a marketing campaign will include details about closures and where to park

Updates from Past Corporate Events:

- 2017 marked Barrie's celebration of Canada 150 programming included:
 - o Canada 150 Mural
 - Created by the community (including the Barrie Art Club, Simcoe Community Services, etc.) and is part of the cross-Canada mural that will be assembled digitally
 - Unveiling held in July and mural is on display at East Bayfield Community Centre
 - Barrie Air Show June 28
 - Highly successful event held in partnership with CFB Borden and Georgian International.
 - Approximately 50,000 viewers gathered around Kempenfelt Bay for performances by the Canadian Forces Snowbirds, CF-18 Demonstration Team, and the Great War Flying Museum, as well as ground displays from CFB Borden.
 - Possible with great support from Lake Simcoe Regional Airport, Barrie Police Service, Barrie Fire & Emergency Services, and Simcoe County Paramedics.

- Beer garden highlighting the local craft beer & cider industry Flying Monkeys, Redline, Barnstormer, and Heritage Estates – featuring a unique collaborative brew created especially for Illuminate Barrie
- Partnered with KP9 Interactive (formerly Augmented Marketing) to create an AR app for the event – prompted participants to engage with Innovation Alley vendors to enter a contest and provided an interactive map of the festival

Upcoming Corporate Events:

- Downtown Countdown Sunday, December 31st Barrie City Hall
 - City's 20th annual New Year's Eve celebration family friendly, free event.
 - Programming will feature skating on the City Hall rink, Snow Valley's mini tube run, horsedrawn wagon rides, face painting, roaming performers, bonfire warming zone, food vendors, and two fireworks shows.
 - Currently accepting submissions from local bands to perform at the event.
 - Entertainment line-up to be announced in late November.
- Barrie Winterfest February 3 & 4, 2018 Heritage Park and venues throughout the community
 - Community tradition with over 25 years of history celebrating the winter season in Barrie and one of Festivals & Events Ontario Top 100 for more than 9 years running.
 - Winterfest 2018 will feature ice and snow sculptures, horse-drawn wagon rides, lumberjack shows, a polar bear dip, winter sports demos, and more, as well as drop-in indoor activities at venues like the Barrie Public Library and the MacLaren Art Centre.
 - Partnerships are a key success factor for Winterfest, from the many organizations that host events and activities as part of the Winterfest programming, to local media and sponsors.
 - The event typically attracts over 20,000 in attendance from across the province and is promoted as a tourism destination through Tourism Barrie's Winter Fun program.
