The Master Mechanics Building is a rectangular structure approximately 34.6 metres by 8.4 metres and is of poured concrete construction with a modified hip roof, exposed corners cut at 45 degrees. Gable ends are covered with cedar shingles. The roof was also originally covered with cedar shingles, since replaced with the asphalt type. Half timbering is used on the south gable. The lower edge of the roof rafters is scalloped. The segmental windows consist of double hung sash, one over one, with a concrete sill and imitation voussoirs with keystone. Canvas awnings were originally placed over each window. The doors were four panelled wood with glazed transoms above. Under the southwest eave is attached a horn, believed to have signalled shift changes, lunch hours, and to notify mechanics of the arrival of engines for repair.
