DC APPEALS

- Earlier payment of Hard service DC's at time of Site Plan Approval
- Voluntary Contributions of \$4,000+ per residential unit
- Key infrastructure projects being financed and delivered by developers (D Projects) in exchange for DC credits up front

- Earlier payment of Hard service DC's at time of Site Plan Approval
- Voluntary Contributions are no longer available as a financing tool
- Transit level of service now forward looking

- DC rates locked in at time of Site Plan Approval
- Industrial DC's paid over 5 years
- Removal of Recreation and Library services from DC's

- 3 parties appealed 2014 DC by-law
- 5 appeals for 2019 DC by-law
