Laurentian University

- Close to 10,000 students this year, up from 6,000 a decade ago
- 102 undergraduate, 25 masters and 8 PhD programs and 53 certificates, diplomas, and professional degrees
- #1 in Canada in total sponsored research income among primarily undergraduate universities for second year in a row
- One of three Canadian universities "on the move" according to Maclean's
- Globe and Mail: "Laurentian has buzz"
- In Barrie since 2001, now 1,000 students + 200 in Orillia in 10 programs
 - Bachelor of Arts in Anthropology, English, History, Law and Justice, Political Science,
 Psychology, Sociology,
 - Bachelor of Social Work, Bachelor of Business Administration, MBA
- Vice-Provost in Barrie: Dr Bernadette Schell
- Independent student government for Laurentian students in Barrie
- Oversight by one Board of Governors and one Senate








Downtown Campus Responds to Community Needs

- Aligns with provincial Growth Plan
 - One of the few among the 25 urban growth centres not to have a university campus.
 - Not only is this a missed opportunity, but the City must plan the appropriate community infrastructure to ensure a complete community.
- One of the City of Barrie's five strategic goals for 2010-2014 is to create a vibrant and healthy city centre. One of the projects identified is to encourage a city centre postsecondary presence.
- Community representatives, including elected officials, business and community leaders, and representatives from the City of Barrie and Simcoe County, the Royal Victoria Hospital, school boards, the Downtown Barrie Business Association (BIA), the Public Library, United Way, Aboriginal and Francophone organizations, told us in May they wanted Laurentian to establish a downtown campus.
- Laurentian students, faculty and staff in Barrie want their dedicated space, more 4year majors.


Why a University Campus in Barrie?

Low participation rate in university studies




Why a University Campus in Barrie?

A Laurentian University Campus in Downtown Barrie

- February 2010: Board approved long-term capital strategic directions
- May 2010: Presentation of vision to City Council, enthusiastic support
- June 2010: Submission of long-term capital priorities to the province,
 \$40M ask to the province
- Since November 2010: Work with city staff to identify potential sites
- May 2011: Community consultation for university's 2012-2017 strategic plan





Laurentian in Downtown Barrie – A Vision for September 2020

- Downtown campus serving 3,000 students (2,500 full-time equivalent) offering:
 - Undergraduate liberal arts and sciences in English
 - AACSB accredited commerce programs
 - Social work
 - Strong commitment to Indigenous education
 - Unique programs such as secure data centres, IT security and computer engineering and environmental science
 - Executive development centre





Laurentian in Downtown Barrie – A Vision for September 2020

- Capital requirements:
 - \$60M academic facility of approx 162,000 sf
 - Student Centre funded through student levy
 - Private student residence on university-owned property
 - Approx 550 parking spaces on university-owned property (funded through permits)
- 10 potential sites identified by City staff
- Ancillary spaces and services can be considered in partnership with student union and/or community partners



Why Laurentian?

- Have been part of the community for over 10 years
- By far the #1 choice for university studies in Simcoe County
- Significant progress over these 10 years
- Permanent investments in tenured faculty already made
- Only university making a commitment to Barrie in its strategic plan, informed by community consultation
- Growing representation from Barrie on Board of Governors, Senate
- \$14M commitment towards the project
- Track record in working with a municipality to secure a downtown campus
- Committed for the long-run



How Will We Get There?

- Laurentian pledge of \$14M towards project
- MoU with city including proposed city pledge of \$14M towards project,
 ideally by end of October
 - Backloaded over 10 years starting in 2013-2014
 - Could partially take the form of city-owned assets
 - Laurentian would commit to "triple match" the city's pledge (City would put in \$14M,
 Laurentian puts in \$14M and will invest or secure another \$28M)
- Launch of community steering committee, chaired by Janice Skot
- Laurentian to submit updated bid jointly with city to provincial government (matching proposal submitted in June 2010)
- Joint site selection
- Gradual transition of programs to new campus

- More high school graduates staying close to home to pursue university studies, cost savings for families

- City of Barrie: Councillor, General Manager of Infrastructure & Development Services, Director of Economic Development
- Community: downtown BIA, downtown residents, hospital, school boards, Chamber of Commerce, Rotary, business, IT data/security, media
- Expertise: urban planning, architecture, real estate, facilitation
- Focus in the short term : advise on downtown site selection and associated matters
- Focus in the medium term :
 - Advise on overall project plan including communications and advocacy;
 - Have designates in selection of design team;
 - Advise on design of campus.
