Starter Company Program

- Provides youth between the ages of 18 29 with the opportunity to receive mentoring, training, and funding up to \$5,000 to start or grow a business.
- Initiated by the Province of Ontario's Ministry of Economic Development and Growth as part of the Youth Employment Strategy. Program launched in 2014.
