I want to make a deputation on Wednesday May, 15th, 2024, regarding the proposed waterfront sports

field.

I will speak as a member of the Bird Friendly city team, regarding council's promises to maintain Migratory Bird habitat, safety, and well-being, as renewed twice in WMBD proclamations. Barrie was the 15th city in Canada to be declared a Bird Friendly city, (and only at entry level, the lowest of three levels). Barrie can also be the FIRST city to LOSE it's Bird Friendly status, as every 2 years cities get reevaluated. Our reevaluation happens September 2024.

Our recently acclaimed, Barrie official city bird, the Belted Kingfisher, nests on the shores of Kempenfelt Bay. The light and noise of a sports field, and destruction of the natural areas to build it, will affect the breeding success, and the safe travels of our mascot and other local and migratory birds, and wildlife.

I can also speak as an aunt of a recent navy marching band member, who had formerly been in the internationally acclaimed Burlington Teen Tour band, and the lack of necessity of a new marching field next to water. They use parking lots to practice marching. The Sadlon Arena and Park Place are near enough to practice on, if they even need ones that big. The navy cadets are not going to be going from boats in the water, directly to marching practice, so a practice field does NOT need to be close to the water. For the few times (if any), they need practice for a patterned marching show, like a football game half time show, they can use a local high school field. Simcoe County doesn't have a CFL team, so that requirement is unlikely.

I am a great aunt and neighbor of sports enthusiasts, who also don't need a sports field to be on the Barrie waterfront, nor one with injury causing heat retaining, climate change impacting artificial turf. One sports field, distant from all others, does not help with any tournaments. The Barrie sports complex on Nursery Rd is best suited for such future endeavors.

The parking lot for the upgraded South Shore Centre doesn't need to be fossil fuel using, impermeable asphalt, when there is the option of permeable interlocking brick needing less painting, road salt, maintenance, and composed of non-polluting natural ingredients like sand and clay. The interlocking brick parking lot at the Orillia Opera House/library/Farmers Market doesn't even need the parking spot lines repainted as they are designated by colour and positioning of the bricks.

Has there been any consultation with our First Nations treaty kin? Our treaty promise includes being good land stewards, protecting the water and our other living inhabitants.
