The Community Services Committee met and reports as follows:

SECTION "A"

GREY AND SIMCOE FORESTERS REGIMENTAL MUSEUM

The Committee met and discussed the Grey and Simcoe Foresters' request for an agreement of perpetual occupancy of the building at 36 Mulcaster Street.

Major P.B. Litster of the Grey and Simcoe Foresters Regiment and Museum, provided historical information regarding the Grey and Simcoe Foresters regiment and the purpose of the museum. He indicated that the Grey and Simcoe Foresters have been involved with the community since 1866. He expressed concern that the regiment may lose the building through the development occurring next door to the building.

Members of the Committee asked several questions related to the information provided and received responses from Mr. Litster and staff. (15-G-274)

GREY AND SIMCOE FORESTERS REGIMENTAL MUSEUM

That staff in the Facilities and Culture Departments provide a report to General Committee regarding the implications of providing perpetual occupancy of the 36 Mulcaster Street Armoury to the Grey and Simcoe Foresters Regimental Museum, as long as it is operated as a museum and heritage centre. FROZEN WATER SERVICES REMEDIATION

J. Thompson, Director of Environmental Services provided an update regarding Frozen Water Services Remediation. Mr. Thompson indicated that funding has been included in the 2016 Business Plan to address additional frozen water services in 2016. R. Forward, General Manager of Infrastructure and Growth Management noted that the program does not extend to remediation of industrial, commercial and institutional properties. Mr. Thompson indicated that a staff report is being prepared regarding the Frozen Water Remediation program.

Members of the Committee asked questions related to liability associated with frozen water services and the remediation process for mixed use properties. (15-G-273)
