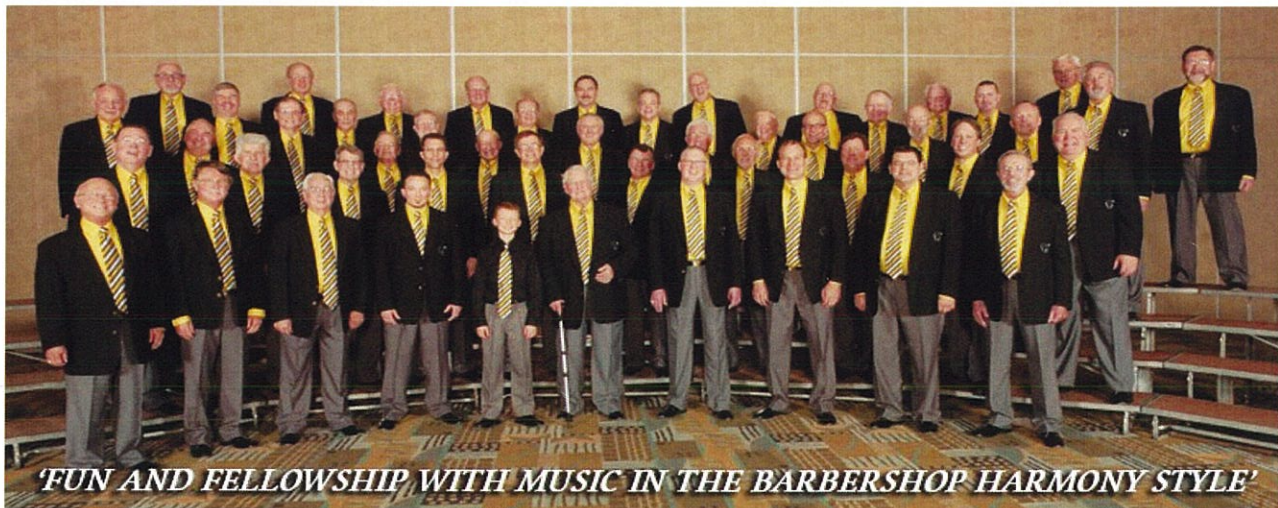

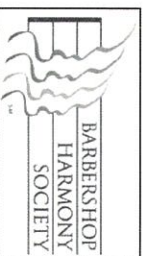
## The County Chordsmen

## Harmonize for Speech

The 32 Ontario Chapters of the Barbershop Harmony Society Have raised over\$4,500,000 for Harmonize for speech, a fund which sponsors speech-related projects and equipment at hospitals, clinics and treatment centres throughout Ontario. The fund also provides text books, bursaries and scholarships for Speech Pathology / Audiology students and research funding at various universities. Since its inception 35 years ago, the Barrie Chapter has contributed \$238,000 to the fund.
