18-A-106 RECOGNITION OF THE PLANNING AND BUILDING SERVICES DEPARTMENT STAFF ON THEIR EFFORTS IN PROTECTING THE HABITAT FOR CHIMNEY SWIFTS LOCATED AT THE BARRIE COLLEGIATE SITE

Mayor Lehman called upon Alan McNair, Conservation Chair of Nature Barrie, Dorothy McKeown, President of Nature Barrie and Phyllis Tremblay and Inga Brinckmann, the Co-ordinators of the Barrie SwiftWatch for the presentation. Mr. McNair provided the background on the work completed by Nature Barrie and its participation in the Ontario SwiftWatch Project. He described the Chimney Swift, its habitat and its status as a threatened species. Mr. McNair spoke to the work that was undertaken by the City of Barrie, Ministry of Natural Resources and HIP Developments with respect to redevelopment of the Barrie Central Collegiate site and the efforts to preserve the chimney on the site which was identified as a nesting and roosting location for Chimney Swifts. Mr. McNair presented a plaque to Acting General Manager of Infrastructure and Growth Management, A. Bourrie to recognize the efforts of the Planning and Building Services Department.

Mayor Lehman thanked Nature Barrie for the recognition and the work they do in the community.

1. Asif Mian

Mr. Asif Mian provided a deputation in opposition to motion 18-G-216 regarding the Property Acquisition to Facilitate McKay Road Trunk Sanitary Sewer and Trunk Watermain. He advised that his father owns land on the southeast and northwest corners of the proposed interchange. He expressed his concerns associated with the amount of land that will be required for the proposed interchange and presented slides displaying other highway interchange alternatives that he believed would utilize less land. Mr. Mian shared his concerns related to the impact on the business operating at 17 McKay Road.

2. Sam Guido

Mr. Sam Guido, owner of Kell's Garden City provided a deputation in opposition to motion 18-G-216 regarding the Property Acquisition to Facilitate McKay Road Trunk Sanitary Sewer and Trunk Watermain. He advised his business, Kell's Garden City, operates from 17 McKay Road and commented that he feels that the proposed interchange will greatly affect his business. Mr. Guido provided the background associated with his business, what the property is currently used for and where the products produced are shipped to. He indicated that he is not opposed to the interchange, but that he believed it is utilizing too much of the property that he operates his business from.

18-G-214 DEVELOPMENT OF STRATEGIC PRIORITIES FOR THE 2018-2022 CITY COUNCIL TERM OF OFFICE

Mayor, J. Lehman welcomed Blaine Parkin and congratulated him on his new role as the City's General Manager of Infrastructure and Growth Management.

Michael Prowse, Chief Administrative Officer provided a presentation regarding the 2018 - 2022 City of Barrie Strategic Priorities. He described how Council's strategic priorities establish the vision for the new term of Council.

M. Prowse discussed slides concerning the following topics:

- The 60 plus services the City provides and diversity of these services;
- The City's organizational chart;
- An overview of the high profile projects currently underway in the City;
- The changes, challenges and opportunities associated with the City;
- The opportunity to build on the strengths of the Corporation;
- A map illustrating the Barrie's population growth by 2031 and 2041;
- A review of the 2014 - 2018 Council Strategic Priorities; and
- A review of why setting strategic priorities is so important for the new term of Council.

In closing, M. Prowse advised that the strategic priorities are set to provide context for the work of today and how it contributes to delivering upon Council's vision.

Mayor Lehman provided remarks related to the strategic planning session for the 2018 to 2022 City Council term of office. He spoke about the importance of the strategic planning exercise and the establishment of strategic priorities for the new term of Council.

Mr. N. Bellchamber from N.G. Bellchamber and Associates discussed his background and provided an overview of the session.

Members of City Council and the City staff present were divided into smaller groups to discuss the demographic, social, political, physical, technological and economical environments. Each group provided issues and opportunities associated with each of the items. Next, the groups discussed three common elements from each category of the breakout session. Each group developed three to five strategic areas of focus and then added three to four specific items under these areas.

General Committee resumed as the larger group and discussed the results produced by the smaller groups. The Committee determined that it had identified the following five priorities for the 2018 to 2022 term of office:

- Growing our economy;
- Fostering a safe and healthy city;
- Building strong neighbourhoods;
- Offering innovative and citizen driven services; and
- Improving the ability to get around Barrie.

General Committee discussed the next steps in the process and requested staff to take the concepts and fully develop the wording to reflect the intent of the strategic planning discussions as well as the specific initiatives and actions, and report back to General Committee by winter of 2019.

M. Prowse thanked the members of Council, City staff and Mr. Bellchamber for their energy, positive approach and time to chart the course for the next four years for this term of office.

This matter was recommended to City Council for consideration of receipt at its meeting to be held on 12/17/2018.

Mr. Sellers discussed slides concerning the following topics:

- The proximity of the subject property with respect to the Primary Intensification Nodes and Primary Intensification Corridors;
- An overview of the development proposal;
- An architectural rendering of the proposed development;
- The Urban Design highlights of the proposed development;
- Illustrations from the Shadow Impact Study;
- The Tree Preservation Plan for the development;
- The requested Official Plan Amendment;
- A chart illustrating the Zoning By-law amendments being requested for the development; and
- A review of the Planning Policy for the area.

Mr. Sellers concluded his presentation and indicated that he believed the applications are appropriate for the area and should be supported.

Mr. Andrew Gameiro, Planner, Planning and Building Services provided details concerning the application, as well as the primary planning and land

use considerations associated with the applications. He advised that the Neighbourhood Meeting was held on April 25, 2018 with 25 local residents attending the meeting. Mr. Gameiro reviewed the changes made by applicant based on items that needed to be addressed due to the adjacent creek and pond, and potential traffic impacts. He advised on the anticipated timelines of the staff report.

VERBAL COMMENTS:

1. **Al McNair, 9 Mountbatten Road**, representing Nature Barrie, shared that Nature Barrie has a long history of involvement with Milligan's Pond and Bunkers Creek. He advised that he supports the preservation of trees and that he believes there is a strong civic interest in maintaining trees whenever possible. Mr. McNair questioned whether the extent of a former landfill under Milligan's Pond is known and discussed his concerns associated with the potential impacts to water quality if the area is disturbed. He advised that the area is an active birding area and encouraged the applicant and City to consider bird sensitive guidelines that have been developed by other jurisdictions when reviewing this development proposal. Mr. McNair questioned the increased density for the development and noted that he felt that this development proposal is not within one of the Primary Intensification Nodes or Urban Growth Area.
2. **Mr. Mario Titus, 2 Toronto Street** questioned whether the development included a hotel and what the construction material for the building will be.

Mr. Sellers provided a response to the question.

3. **Steve Ferguson, 3 Boys Street South** questioned whether the subject lot was filled illegally in the past. He advised that he believes the proposal for 8 storeys is too high and the requirements for piles for this height of building will be too disruptive to the land, especially being so close to Milligan's Pond and Bunkers Creek.
