- That the City of Barrie establish a special charge 0.349931% for 2015 to levy an amount of \$492,366 upon commercial and industrial properties in the Downtown Improvement Area.
- 2. That the City Clerk be authorized to prepare the appropriate by-law authorizing this 2015 special charge rate and levy requirement. (FIN005-15) (File: F00)

### 15-G-093 RENAMING A PORTION OF PROCLAMATION DRIVE (WARD 10)

- 1. That a portion of the road known as Proclamation Drive on registered Plan 51M-683 be renamed to Prince George Crescent and that the properties fronting onto this portion of the road be renamed accordingly once the subdivision to the east legally described as Part Lot 17, Concession 12 formerly Innisfil Township (D12-411) is registered on title.
- 2. That the draft plan conditions be amended to include the condition that the developer to the east, legally described as Part Lot 17, Concession 12 formerly Innisfil Township (D12-411):
  - Pay for new street name plaques for the homes that have plaques that identify the street name in addition to the street number; and
  - b) To contact the existing residents on Proclamation Drive once the construction begins and advise them of the proposed name change. (PLN011-15) (File: D19-PRO)

## 15-G-094 REZONING 306-318 GEORGIAN DRIVE - STUDENT RESIDENCE (WARD 1)

- That the Rezoning Application submitted by Podium Developments for property municipally known as 306, 310, 314 and 318 Georgian Drive from Residential Apartment Dwelling Second Density with Special and Holding Provisions (RA2-2)(SP)(H) and Residential Single Dwelling Second Density R2 to Residential Multiple Dwelling Second Density RM2(SP) and Environmental Protection EP be approved.
- 2. That the Official Plan Land Use Schedule A be amended to recognize the Environmental Protection Area included on the subject lands.
- 3. That notwithstanding the permitted uses and zoning standards in the RM2 zone, the following Special Provisions (SP) shall be recognized and referenced in the implementing Zoning By-law for the subject lands:
  - a) Permitted uses shall be restricted to a dormitory in a stacked townhouse built form;
  - A reduced parking standard of 1 space per 4 students is permitted for the dormitory dwelling units whereas 1 per 2 students is required;
  - c) Parking space stalls shall have a minimum width of 2.6m whereas 2.7m is required;
  - d) A maximum density of 72 units per hectare whereas a maximum of 53 units per hectare is required;
  - e) Maximum building height of 12.5m whereas a maximum of 10m is required;
  - f) An amenity area of 10.1m2 per unit whereas 12m2 per unit is required;
  - g) A maximum permitted area for accessory buildings and structures of 75m2 whereas a maximum of 50m2 is required;
  - A rear yard setback of 0.2m for the accessory structure for garbage/refuse whereas a minimum of 0.6m is required;
  - External locking mechanisms are permitted on bedrooms in dormitory dwelling units that prevent access to said bedrooms by the other dwelling occupants/tenants when the bedroom is un-occupied; and

- j) Dormitory dwelling units are restricted to single occupancy bedrooms and shall not be classified as a Boarding Lodging Rooming House.
- That the City not acquire the Environmental Protection lands in public ownership.
- 5. That no further public notice is required in accordance with Section 34(17) of the Planning Act. (PLN013-15) (File: D14-1578)

This matter was recommended (Section "B") to City Council for consideration of adoption at its meeting to be held on 5/4/2015.

The General Committee met for the purpose of a public meeting at 7:06 p.m.

Mayor Lehman advised the public that any concerns or appeals dealing with the application that was the subject of the Public Meeting should be directed to the Legislative and Court Services Department. Any interested persons wishing further notification of the staff report regarding the application were advised to sign the appropriate notification form required by the Legislative and Court Services. Mayor Lehman confirmed with the Director of Planning Services that notification was conducted in accordance with the Planning Act. Mayor Lehman indicated that after the applicant's representative presented their proposal, staff would be providing an overview of the status of the application and summary of the initial feed back received to date through the ward meeting process, as well as from commenting agencies and internal departments. He stated that the staff recommendation on the application would be presented through a staff report to General Committee at a later date.

APPLICATION FOR AN AMENDMENT TO THE ZONING BY-LAW AND DRAFT PLAN OF SUBDIVISION - MACAULAY SHIOMI HOWSON LTD. ON BEHALF OF VISTACAN INVESTMENTS INC. - 10 CAPPS DRIVE (WARD 10) (FILES: D12-418/D14-1584)

Ms. Angela Sciberras of MacAulay Shiomi Howson Ltd. advised that the purpose of the public meeting was to review an application for an amendment to the Zoning By-law and Draft Plan of Subdivision submitted by MacAulay Shiomi Howson Ltd. on behalf of Vistacan Investments Inc. for lands located at 10 Capps Drive.

Mr. Sciberras provided a slide presentation concerning the application. She discussed slides concerning the following topics:

- an aerial view of the subject site;
- the timelines associated with the application process, specifically the ward meeting;
- her professional planning opinion that the application is in compliance with Provincial Policies and the City of Barrie's Official Plan
- the existing and proposed zoning;
- an excerpt from the City of Barrie Zoning By-law illustrating the subject site and surrounding properties;
- a chart detailing the proposed zoning and site specific provisions compared to the standards for the R2 Zoning Category;
- an illustration of the proposed siting of a house on a lot;
- an artist's renderings of the proposed elevations for the residential homes:
- the proposed Draft Plan of Subdivision;
- the background studies submitted in support of the application;
- a map illustrating the General Servicing Plan; and
- general servicing information.

In closing, Ms. Sciberras commented that the developer is working with staff to resolve some of the outstanding issues associated with the application. She advised of the Federal legislation concerning migratory birds and the timing for clearing of trees, noting that the developer is hoping to commence site works in the beginning of September.

Ms. Carlissa McLaren, Development Planner discussed items associated with the application that are currently being considered by Planning staff, including proposed reductions in the front yard setback to an attached garage and encroachment of stairs and bay windows into any required yard, boundary tree preservation and compensation, the efficient use of land and possible impacts to the adjacent residential neighbourhood. She noted that the Draft Plan of Subdivision has been submitted concurrently with the rezoning application.

Ms. McLaren advised that a Ward Meeting was held on February 26, 2015 and advised of the public comments received, including the concerns with respect to tree removals, preservation and compensation plantings, access to existing residence, the proposed building setbacks and form of development, the extension of services and completion of Capps Drive, the extension of the existing sidewalk and the impact of construction, grading and street cleaning. She noted that it is anticipated that the Staff Report concerning the application would be presented to General Committee on June 15, 2015 and that the approval of the Draft Plan of subdivision would happen concurrently. She reminded General Committee that staff have delegated authority to approve the Draft Plan of Subdivision, so would not be presented for consideration as part of the staff report.

2. Mr. Andre Champoux, 59 Miller Drive advised he does not live in the vicinity of the proposed development. He discussed his concerns with respect to loss of greenspace and the possible impact on the assessment of the surrounding properties. He asked questions concerning the notification associated with the Public Meeting and the determination of any impacts on property values.

Ms. McLaren provided a response to Mr. Champoux concerning the notification process.

3. Mr. Michael Speller, 8 Capps Drive commented that he lives adjacent to the proposed development and he is not concerned about his property value. He stated that he feels his property value will likely increase as a result of the proposed development.

Members of General Committee did not ask any questions of the applicant's representative or City staff.
