

WHY AN ICE ALLOCATION POLICY?

- To clearly identify the corporation's commitment, philosophy and guiding principles governing the equitable assignment and management of indoor ice time within municipally owned arena facilities.
- To clearly identify corporate goals, objectives and standards of practice.
- To ensure structure and consistency in the ice allocation process.
- To be fair and equitable

POLICY HIGHLIGHTS – Section 5

- 1. Defined User Priority Ranking.
 - a) City of Barrie LTF Department Programs
 - b) Youth Partner Groups
 - c) Tournaments & Special Events
 - d) Adult Seasonal Clients
 - e) Boards of Education
 - f) Occasional and Commercial Users





POLICY HIGHLIGHTS – Section 6

- 2. Residency Requirement
 - All Youth Partner Groups and Adult Seasonal Client Groups will be required to produce Registrant Data Information to the City of Barrie.
 - b) Ice Allocation eligibility for the upcoming season of play will be based on registrant data information.
 - c) Priority shall be given to City of Barrie residents and residents of a surrounding municipality with a City of Barrie Council endorsed Residency Recognition Agreement




POLICY HIGHLIGHTS - Section 11

- 3. <u>Definition of Ice Time Hour</u>
 - a) A one (1) hour block of ice time shall be defined as fifty (50) minutes of ice time play with the remaining ten (10) minutes of time utilized by facility operations staff for ice maintenance purposes.
 - b) Block bookings least impact

Where there exists only one ice pad within a municipal arena, all rentals shall commence on the hour mark.

Where there exists two ice pads within a municipal arena, all rentals shall commence on the ½ hour mark.
