# Report to City Council City of Barrie Seniors Advisory Committee



Monday, November 24, 2014



The Seniors Advisory Committee (SAC) was created by Council in 2014 with the first meeting held March 24, 2014.

- Term of SAC ends with term of Council
- SAC is composed of 11 members:
  - 1 member of Council + Mayor (de facto)
  - 1 representative of CARP
  - 1 representative of 55+ Advisory Council
  - 4 representatives of not-for-profit agencies
  - 4 citizen members plus staff support

- Completed text of Needs Assessment Survey and prepared distribution
- Finalized web page wording
- Initiated work on the Community Profile



#### **July**

- Received City of Barrie Customer Services Strategy Presentation
- Distributed Needs Assessment Survey (hard copy and electronic)
- Assisted in developing the World Town Planning Day Workshop with Planning Service Department for November



#### **August and September**

- Preliminary Needs Assessment Survey total of 235 (23.5%) responses
- Compilation of Survey responses
- Many responses indicated interest in participating in a more detailed survey
- Launched Age-Friendly Barrie Web page (Hub)

- Workshop Initial drafting of Presentation to Council
- Preparation for World Town Planning Day

   Needs Assessment for the City Council Presentation
- Successful World Town Planning Day Workshop 100 attendees
- Updates to Age-Friendly Barrie Web page



#### Findings by the Committee

#### Demographics of the City of Barrie

- Aging population 65 years + increasing from 11 % to 19% by 2031
- In 2013 17,300 seniors estimated
- In 2031 65,100 seniors projected

#### Why the Increase?

- Natural aging of population (Baby Boomers)
- Attractiveness of Barrie
- Average life span increases (females 87.8 yr males

```
85.3 yr)
The City of

```

#### Communication

- Not everyone has access to a Computer; provide educational opportunities to learn to use
- Leveraging existing communications tools (This Week in Barrie, PALS newsletter, digital monitors etc.) to highlight seniors info. (special events, programs/services, BACTS etc.)
- Create an on-line Seniors Resource Section on Barrie.ca with a link to Age-friendly page including an inventory of computers available to the public.



#### **Communication** Cont'd

- Provide regular information sessions at Rec Centres or Residences, ie. Service Groups etc...
- Leverage local media contacts, ie. CTV, Rogers local newspapers
- Identify target areas and facilities to circulate information, ie., library, church bulletins;



Lack of availability of various types of housing:

- Shortage of social housing (rent geared to income)
- Waitlist for year 2013 includes 603 seniors with a wait time of 4.6 years
- Needs Survey identified a desire for aging in place (house or apartment) – need for support such as mobility aids, transportation, meals on wheels, house modifications



#### **Housing** Cont'd

- Desire for bungalow design preferred for aging in place
- Encourage builders to construct bungalow style houses and bungalow style townhouses
- Increase seniors rental housing
- Desire for older seniors to move from house to seniors building or active care unit
- Affordability issues for aging in place due to maintenance, costs of water, heating, electricity, City taxes



#### **Housing** Cont'd

- Concern for condominium ownership with increasing maintenance fees and designs not appropriate for accessibility
- Look at other purpose built types of seniors housing ie. life lease – rental, co-housing



#### **Transportation**

- Consideration of an all-inclusive information document on transportation;
- Offer information by newspaper and handouts;
- Better advertising; examine existing options "This Week In Barrie", links to phone numbers;
- Partner with other entities, ie Waste Reduction Calendar to create better partnerships;



#### **Transportation** Cont'd

- Promote seniors on the move; train the trainer education; change the perception about Transit and BACTS
- Travel Information Sheets outlining steps/routes to get there, ie. Destination specific
- Better Signage
- Affordable transportation alternatives
- Better advertising of existing transportation seniors discounts
- Promote Active Transportation Routes ie. trails
