National Day of Mourning has been recognized since April 28th, 1991; and WHEREAS:

WHEREAS: On April 28th, we remember and honour those lives lost or injured due to a workplace

tragedy, and collectively renew the commitment to improve health and safety in the

workplace and prevent further injuries, illnesses and deaths; and

WHEREAS; The Association of Workers' Compensation Boards of Canada (AWCBC) reported in

> 2019 there were 925 workplace fatalities were recorded in Canada. Among these deaths were 29 young workers aged 15-24. There were 271,806 accepted claims for lost time due to a work-related injury or disease, including 33,615 from workers aged 15-24. These numbers do not reflect unreported instances, so the total number of

workers impacted is even greater; and
