The purpose of this Memorandum is to provide members of Council with an update concerning the development of the Heritage Park Master Plan in 2021. Heritage Park is located at 5 Simcoe Street on the north shore of Kempenfelt Bay.

Over the past several months, a consulting team has carried out multiple stakeholder meetings that have led the Design Team to identify key issues, constraints and opportunities that require exploration with the public during this master plan process. Three concepts have been developed to explore varying levels of enhancements to the park. Two sessions of community consultation are proposed to obtain public feedback regarding the future of the park; the meeting scheduled below will be the first of the two meetings and the Final Concept will be presented this fall at the second meeting. In accordance with COVID-19 protocols, two virtual Public Information Centres (PIC) will be held on:

To advise residents and businesses of the PIC, a Notice of Public Information Centre will be mailed to property owners within a 150-metre radius of the park boundaries on May 17, 2021. Attendees may register online through **buildingbarrie.ca** and the PIC will be advertised on social media by May 21, 2021. In addition to the property owners, key stakeholders will also be invited to attend which includes, but are not limited to: Barrie Tourism, the Barrie Native Friendship Centre, and the Downtown Barrie Business Association (BIA).

To ensure City Council has the information at the same time as the public, this memo has been provided with a copy of the attached letter to residents (Appendix "A").

Development Services staff and the consulting firm SHIFT Landscape Architecture will present three different concepts for the future development of Heritage Park during the Public Information Centre and host a live comment session during two separate meeting times. The concepts and presentation will also be posted on buildingbarrie.ca. Residents, property owners and interest groups are invited to complete an online survey or submit comments by **Friday**, **June 11**, **2021**.


